Language Arts

Subject-Related Material

Continue reading to or with your with your child:

Practice reading comprehension by asking questions to your child about what they read. Ask him/ her to predict and infer what is happening in the story. Practice multiplication tables with your son/daughter. Some students have completed multiplication to 12 and should now be practicing division facts.

Flashcards Timed multiplication test with 25 problems
